Agenda Items Eligible for Membership & Board of Directors Consideration:

9. Amend REG103.3 to allow the use of symbols when naming a horse. **
10. Amend REG104.1 to allow horses that are registered with APHA and have majority Quarter Horse lineage to be eligible for registration using allowances similar to Thoroughbred/Quarter Horse crosses. **
11. Amend REG104.4 and REG105.5, for horses being registered based on an international studbook, to include a statement that if the unregistered lineage traces to Appendix/Appendix or Appendix/Thoroughbred cross, it is ineligible for registration. **
12. Amend REG103.4.3, REG103.4.4 and REG118.4 to include a statement that a horse name cannot be changed if it has a record of performance in the QData database. **
13. Add REG114.18 to recognize the color Buckskin Roan. **
14. Add REG114.19 to recognize the color Palomino Roan. **
15. Amend REG109 to include immune mediated myositis (IMM) as a genetic defect and undesirable trait and add a statement to registration certificates of foals descending from a horse who is a carrier that AQHA recommends testing to confirm presence or absence of the mutation. **
16. Add immune mediated myositis (IMM) to the genetic health panel. **

Agenda Items Eligible for Discussion Only:

17. Discuss suggestion to require stallion owners to report the inventory of frozen semen of a deceased horse
18. Discuss REG104.4 and REG105.5 regarding registration of horses based on an international studbook certificate of registration (15/16 rule).
 - a. Suggestion to require semen permits and/or breeder's certificates for horses being registered under one of these rules
 - b. Suggestion to put a time limit for allowance of horses to be registered under these rules. For example, upon the expiration of 10 years after an affiliate with their own studbook registers its first horse under one of these rules, all subsequent horses would need to (i) be registered under traditional rules of registration; (ii) satisfy the number to number; number to appendix; or number to Thoroughbred requirements; and (iii) be subject to the submission of traditional registration documents.
